BOOTS COOTIN' DEVILS HISTORY

For those who don't know about Bootscootin' Devils here is a little bit of our History;

In 2004 the line dance group known as Country Coyotes, led by Rick Marton, finished when Rick decided he needed a lifestyle/work change. Rick had run Country Coyotes successfully for 10 years, with many classes throughout the North West region.

With Ricks help, the dance group continued. We chose the name *Bootscootin' Devils* and a members daughter designed our logo. We started off by using an AKAI CD player, Janet or Jenni would bring along music on CD's and play requests. We gradually added teaching by anyone game enough, i.e. Jenni G, Jenny Bye or Jenny P (Gee, glad my name wasn't Jenny).

From one session/week, the CD player and the occasional social, we now have four classes / week, two sound systems, mics, regular socials, a Newsletter, Website & email address. But most importantly we have a great hard working committee and enthusiastic, fun loving members.

Jenni P & Jenni G are the main teachers but everyone is encouraged to give teaching a go. (our teachers are not paid)

Our group actively encourages new dancers to the art of Line Dancing and luckily we usually get several new dancers every year. We also accept help and the knowledge of other clubs in Tasmania, so that we can be working toward the same goal.

In our early days we were lucky enough to have Bill Larson & his group to attend one of our 1st socials while he was visiting the State. He & his group were gracious enough to do a little teaching at our social. I personally will always remember that night and cannot thank

Bill enough for his kindness to our new fledgling club.

Our Club since then hosted one Workshop in our very early days. The delightful Darren Mitchell lead our dancers for a wonderful afternoon of learning. It was a little clouded for us, as one of our dancers passed away that day after a short battle with cancer. To this day I still cannot do some of those dances, only remembering that is the day Josie died. (Carmel, Josie's good friend, would agree).

Since then members of our group have attended many workshops @ St Helen's, Portarlinton, used Gordon Elliotts Workshop dance sheets to improve their enjoyment of line dancing.

To continue to learn, enjoy and improve our skills in Line dancing.

From the beginning our group decided to put all our profits back into charity. We support a diverse section of our community, Women's Support Groups, Meals for those less fortunate than us, Animal welfare (native & domestic), local deserving families who are doing it tough and National charities & major fundraisers. Every year we aim to increase our annual donations and so far we have succeeded. We also host morning teas for Adult day care & entertain at Aged Care Homes.

Our MAIN aim is to have fun;

life is too short not to enjoy what we have at this moment in time. Yes we can be a little crazy at times but we enjoy ourselves, do some good deeds for charity and do no harm to others.

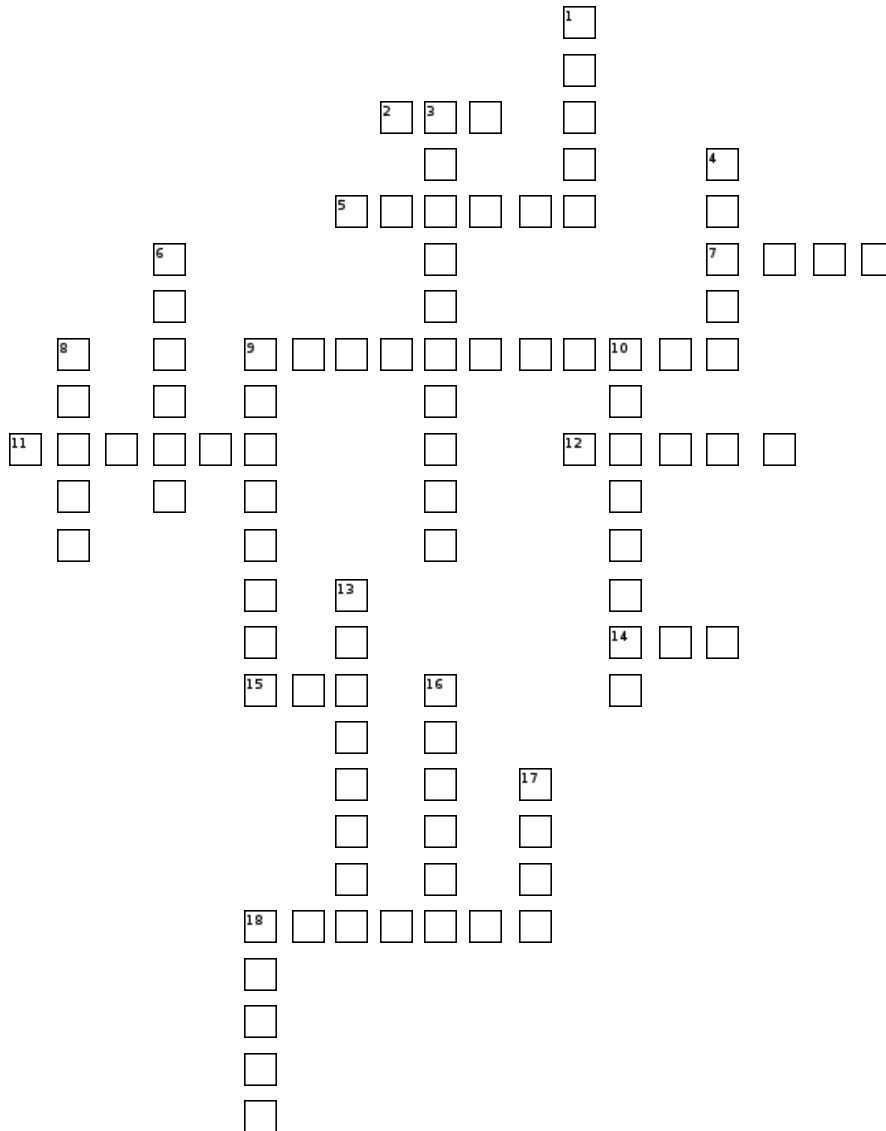
